

# Remote Indigenous *participation* Award

The Ecological Society of Australia, the Centre for Aboriginal Economic Policy Research and the Australian National University are offering eligible applicants limited funds to support participation in the 'Combining Indigenous and western ecological knowledge for future land management solutions' symposium and Indigenous ecology forum at the upcoming ESA conference in Canberra, 6-10 December 2010. The funding will cover or partially cover travel, accommodation and conference registration: the level of funding will depend on the number and quality of applications.

4. Submit the Award application form and presentation abstract to Gail Spina, the ESA Executive Officer, by July 31, 2010.
